Activity/Project Description:

- As students listen to various stories, they identify characters by name/species
- > Start with "How Coyote Brought Fire to the People", any story can be used
- > Emotions can be discussed as issues/opportunities arise using Dee Ni vocabulary, i.e. conflictive behavior to be resolved, etc.
- > "Feelings" elements are added to Dee Ni journal as reinforcement ("Emotions with Dee Ni words)

- ➤ Picture flash cards with emoticons representing feeling concepts
- > Audio recording of feelings vocabulary words

- ➤ Half sheet hand-outs with emoticon and corresponding vocabulary
- Poster illustrations representing feelings concepts
