After completing the lesson, Students and/or Instructors will be able to:

- 1. Identify the school and local landmarks on a simple map
- 2. Describe a route from the school to locations around the community
- 3. Follow map directions
- 4. Use Dee Ni vocabulary to give directions to locations on a map

Activity/Project Description:

- ➤ Students are chaperoned in small groups and do a "Quest" scavenger hunt activity. Instructions are given in Dee Ni. The hunt leads them to various community locations where the "Quest Book" is stamped and their next clue is given using Dee Ni vocabulary. This is also an opportunity for students to use their Greetings and Goodbyes vocabulary for additional book stamps. The quest ends at the Dance House for a story.
- Fach business location provides the students with information about what they do. (i.e. fire safety information at the Fire Station)
