Activity/Project Description:

- > Version One:
 - o Students are given illustrated word cards that make up a simple sentence.
 - At the go signal, students race to arrange the cards in proper Dee Ni syntax. When a student thinks they have done this successfully, they "ring in" and the game is stopped until the sentence can be verified. The first one finished wins a brand new car!
 - Sentences are then read aloud and translated into English by other students.
 - Students can create their own "challenge" sentences for their classmates to arrange and translate.
- ➤ Version Two:
 - Students are each given one word of a simple Dee Ni sentence. At the go signal, students try to arrange themselves in proper syntax. Go fast!
 - o Once they are arranged properly, each student says their word in ordert down the line.
