After completing the lesson, Students and/or Instructors will be able to:

- 1. Understand and follow simple one- and two-step instructions spoken in Dee Ni;
- 2. Understand the guiding principles of the SVS Discipline Policy (Be Safe, Be Respectful, Be Responsible)
- 3. Respond to and offer simple feedback spoken in Dee Ni;
- 4. Further understand the purpose of rules and the function of authority figures in school and wider society;
- 5. Refine student understanding of the pattern of you/your me/my/mine noun and verb conjugation.

Activity/Project Description:

- ➤ Classroom teacher collaborates with Dee Ni language instructor to create an initial set of translated school and classroom rules. These translations will be recorded as disks, DVDs, and printed materials. The teacher can then use these materials "as is" and play them to the class; they can use the materials to memorize the content and teach it that way, or any combination. There will be supplemental worksheets and flashcards, and students will work to create an illustrated rulebook, room posters, and handouts. These materials can be saved and used for subsequent kindergartens.
- Students discuss issues of respect and kindness then create a 3-fold pamphlet illustrating 3-4 examples of ways to show respect/kindness to Elders. (Phrases/examples are stated in both Dee Ni and English. Phrases will need to be translated by a Dee Ni speaker) A small group of Elders could visit and help with this activity.
