### **Activity/Project Description:**

- ➤ Grades K-5 contribute student artwork & photographs to the creation of a 12 month calendar. Each month is assigned one of the "cultural universals", and this serves as a theme for the month's artwork/photography. The calendar has information about district holidays, important tribal & community events, seasonal activities, gathering & preparing etc.
- → 4<sup>th</sup> graders assemble images and create calendar layout using appropriate software
- Calendar is printed and copies are given to community businesses, organizations, individuals, etc. This would be a great Fall fundraiser prior to Christmas.
- Monthly newsletter with school & sports information published by 5<sup>th</sup> grade.
- Each month should include vocabulary and phrases to learn related to season & theme.
