- Students may choose to modify forms, and/or create new forms
- > Student of the Month nominations should include increasingly detailed rationales, although effort is the main idea. Nominations are not graded, per se.
- Third graders should be expected to provide a list of properly conjugated words, i.e. "He/She tries", "He/She is fair",
- Forth graders should add: "He she tries hard", "He/She is always fair", "He/She is very funny"
- Fifth graders should include more details, examples of good deeds, etc.
